




Robert Creeley - A Biography

This book is a biography which focuses on the first 40 years of Creeley's life - years of rebellion, restless travel, tumultuous liasons, and anger and violence that gave his writing an idiosyncratic new voice of razor-sharp precision and vehemence. As a small press publisher and editor, Creeley possessed an unfailing flair for recognizing talent, and promoted the likes of Layton, Ginsberg, Kerouac, Olson, and Burroughs. Their stars rose while he scraped by, until his poetry collection For Love and a novel, The Island, earned him fame and a critical acclaim largely denied the Beat writers.
